



# IBROX STADIUM VISITING FANS GUIDE



Rangers FC was founded in 1872 by a group of young men in Glasgow, laying the foundations for one of the most successful and historic clubs in world football. The club have a rich history in both domestic and European competitions, including winning 55 Scottish league titles and the 1972 European Cup Winners' Cup. Known for its passionate support and strong traditions, Rangers have a global fanbase and a proud footballing heritage, making Ibrox one of the most iconic stadiums in the game.

First opened in 1899, located at 150 Edmiston Drive, Glasgow, Ibrox Stadium has been the home of Rangers FC for over 125 years. The stadium has a capacity of 51,700, and features the iconic Bill Struth Main Stand, a Category B listed building, designed by Archibald Leitch.



# VISITING FAN GUIDE

---

We look forward to welcoming you to Glasgow, Scotland's largest city. Glasgow is a vibrant cultural and sporting hub known for its rich history, friendly locals, and passionate football culture. The city can be reached via 3 main airports, including Glasgow International Airport (GLA), Glasgow Prestwick (PIK), and Edinburgh Airport (EDI). Glasgow offers a wealth of attractions, such as the Glasgow Cathedral, Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum, Buchanan Street for shopping, the Riverside Museum, and the Glasgow Science Centre.

Visiting supporters are also welcome to visit the Rangers Museum, located in Edmiston House, adjacent to Ibrox Stadium. Further information on the museum can be found [here](#).




# RECOMMENDED AREAS

---

The club generally recommends away supporters enjoy the bars and restaurants within the city centre. George Square and the Merchant City are usually chosen due to the central location and large number of bars and restaurants.

It is advised to avoid Paisley Road West on matchday, this is an area densely populated with Rangers bars and will be extremely busy with home supporters.

Please note, drinking alcohol in public in Glasgow is prohibited and may result in a £60 fine. It is also illegal to smoke in enclosed public spaces in Scotland.



# GETTING HERE

---

- **Subway:** The best route from the city centre to Ibrox Stadium is via the Subway. Away supporters are advised to alight at Govan station rather than Ibrox due to the location of the away section of the stadium.
- **Wheelchair Accessibility:** The Subway offers wheelchair-user access at only 2 stations – St Enoch (City Centre) and Govan (1 mile from stadium and recommended for away fans).
- **Walking:** It is an approximate 45-minute walk from the City Centre to Ibrox Stadium. If a corteo is arranged, Police Scotland will advise on the route that should be taken.



# PARKING AT IBROX

---

For high-risk matches, Rangers provide access to the away car park at Broomloan Road. The use of this must be confirmed by our safety officer in advance of the fixture.

# STADIUM ACCESS

---

- The away section is situated at the northwest corner of the stadium (entrance GW1-3). This can be expanded to include BF5 and BR5 depending on the allocation.
- Turnstiles open 90 minutes before kick-off.
- There are two access points for disabled supporters (including wheelchair users), depending on allocation: Govan West Corner via Exit 36 and Broomloan Front via Exit 34
- Turnstile numbers T76 & T77 for general allocation. Can include T69-T75 depending on allocation.

# BAG POLICY

---

- Small bags are permitted but are subject to searches.
- Bags must be smaller than A4. No storage facilities are available at the stadium.

# FLAGS, BANNERS & EQUIPMENT

---

- Flags under 3m x 2m are generally allowed. They should have a fire retardancy certificate.
- Large overhead/surfing banners are not permitted.
- Flags and banners will be inspected, and offensive or political messages are prohibited.
- Drums and Megaphones: Permitted with prior confirmation.
- TIFO Requests: Can be coordinated with our safety officer.



## FACILITIES

---

- **Card-Only Payments:** Ibrox Stadium is cashless; all purchases require card payment.
- **Refreshments:** Soft drinks, water, Bovril, tea, coffee, hot dogs, and pies are available. Alcohol is not allowed to be sold within the stadium due to Scottish Laws.
- **Accessible Toilets:** Located in the away section and require a RADAR key, which will be possessed by stewards in this area.

## SMOKING POLICY

---

- Smoking and vaping are prohibited within the stadium.

## TICKETING & ACCESSIBILITY

---

- **Number of tickets available:** Up to 2600.
- **Disabled Supporter Allocation:** The allocation depends on the away team's ticket uptake. The away corner includes 8 wheelchair spaces + 8 companions, and Broomloan Front includes 4 + 4, totalling 12 spaces for wheelchairs and 12 companion seats.

## TICKET CENTRE

---

- Located across from the away section and clearly signposted. This facility is only available for home supporters.



# POST-MATCH TRAVEL

- External segregation or away supporter holdbacks may occur, this will be at the discretion of our safety officer in partnership with Police Scotland.
- Post-match travel via the Subway or buses can be congested. Walking back to the city centre takes approximately 45 minutes.
